EXPLANATION OF GRADES AND METHODS OF RECORDING

I-Incomplete: A grade of "I" is considered "Incomplete." To be eligible to receive the grade of "I," the student must have completed three-fourths of the course work with a passing grade.

F-Failure: An "F" Grade may be made up only by repeating the course, however, the original grade and course will remain on transcript.

T (Grade): Transfer grade; not included in GPA Calculation

*** (Grade):** Below College level; no credit granted.

Repeated Courses

When a course is repeated, an "E" (excluded) is recorded beside the points of the repeated Subject to indicate that the course has been repeated. The repeated subject, including credit and grade, is recorded in the term it was repeated. An "I" (included) is recorded beside the points of the repeated course that is included in the GPA.

GPA

All grade-point averages are computed on the number of credits carried for each student registered except for credits with grade, "p," "i," "W," or "WP." After July 1, 1974, only the last repeated course will be included in the calculations of The cumulative GPA.

Miscellaneous Information

Courses numbered 001-099 are below university level.

No credit is counted toward a degree.

Graduate Credit-all 500 and above numbered courses are graduate level. A limited number of 400 level courses are accepted in a graduate program
